- **1. Roll Call:** *Quorum established. Meeting called to order at 6:32pm.* John Chapman-President, Roman Jones-Treasurer, Bill Franco-Vice President, Khema Wright-Director, Ian MacKenzie-Director, Enrico Aveo-Secretary
- **2. Traffic Engineer:** Chris LeDew
 - A. Street Parking:
 - ➤ Roads within the community are city roads and anyone can park on them, if they please.
 - ➤ Vehicles cannot impede traffic, if parked on the road; they cannot block the flow of traffic. There must be at least 10ft clearance for other cars to pass.
 - ➤ Parking on the grass is not illegal, but against HOA standards. The city does not govern this, the HOA does.
 - When the city enforces a "no parking" location, they look at the crash history, in the area. If crashes continue to happen, because of parking, the city will evaluate and enforce "no parking" in certain spots. When communities do this, it just pushes the problem further down the street. Chris doesn't advise this.
 - Some communities want to prohibit street parking all together...no resident or guest can ever park on the street.
 - Some communities want to prohibit parking on one side of he street...75% of all affected residences (owners) must sign a petition (will consider renters in the decisions, but not in the 75%). "No Parking" signs would then be installed on peoples' property, at the Association's expense.
 - Resident question: Can there just be one side at the entrance of the community that states that parking is on just one side of the street? Officer Spencer: It would not be enforceable. If the vehicle is parked to city standards, without a sign in the location, JSO cannot issue citations.

B. Traffic calming:

- ➤ John Chapman: Attempted to get them installed on Sutton Lakes Blvd. At the time, were not able to get in contact with owners. Owners ignored multiple letters.
- ➤ Officer Spencer: just because communities lower the speed limit, doesn't mean that the drivers will obey the speed.
- > Different streets can have different speed limits.

- > 75% affected needed for both speed limit reduction and speed humps (city ordinance). If there is cut through traffic, the city will pick up ½ of the cost. Streets within the community, not used as a cut through, all costs for signs/humps will be absorbed by the Association.
 - Management question: Since Sutton Lakes is a cut through from Beach to Atlantic, how would the city determine which streets are cut throughs, since you can get to the cut through from multiple streets? Chris LeDew: The cut through is considered the shortest path. The city will look at the map and evaluate the shortest path between the two streets. Officer Spencer: Noticed that since humps were put in on Willesdon East (the shortest path), traffic speeds along Sutton Lakes Blvd and/or Willesdon West, just to avoid the humps.
- C. School bus issues: many buses use the community as a cut through and travel at high speeds.
