Community Ponds

There are 15 ponds in the Sutton Lakes community and are in place to help contain the stormwater throughout. Charles Aquatics is the company that services the ponds and below is a letter regarding the summer's impact on ponds.

During the summer months, water temperatures rise and perimeter vegetation, along with submersed vegetation, will grow. For residents living on the ponds, be mindful of a few rules of thumb when caring for your lawn during the hot season. The number one cause of algae blooms is an increase in nutrients in the water. Nutrients can come from several sources - grass clippings and fertilizer, to name a couple. Be sure to follow the Duval County guidelines for fertilizing your yard if you are on a pond. Leave an unfertilized strip of approximately 10 feet between the fertilized lawn grass and the water body. This unfertilized margin will ensure that no fertilizer granules get into the water body. Additionally, when you mow the grass without a bag and you are near the water, shoot the grass clippings back onto your lawn to provide nutrients to it, instead of the pond. The water levels became very low this summer due to lack of rain. This also increases the chance of having the above issues.

Reminders:

- It is the resident's responsibility to maintain the lawn down to the water's edge.
- Remove perimeter trash, from the pond, on your property.
- Fences down to the water's edge are **PROHIBITED**
