Safety for one's family and self, is a top priority for most. The days of making a quick trip to the store, and leaving the doors unlocked, are gone. We must all be very mindful of the simple things, we can do, to protect ourselves, our home, and our personal property.

- Keep all house doors and car doors locked, if you are not in direct eyesight of the door(s).
 Set a nightly alarm, on your mobile devices(s), as a reminder to check all your locks.
- 2. Park your vehicle(s) in your garage.

- 3. Add exterior lights to your home, that have motion sensors, that indicate someone is too close. Solar-powered options are now available. (Harbor Freight)
- 4. Install sound sensors on your windows.
- Install a doorbell with a camera. (Best Buy/Home Depot)
- 6. Never leave a firearm in your vehicle, whether its locked, or not.
- 7. Keep your vehicle clear of personal items, especially electronics.
- 8. Get to know your neighbors.
- If you're leaving town for an extended period, have a family member or friend, check on your home periodically.
- 10. ALWAYS report suspicious activity to JSO.
