Reminders and Suggestions

In order to uphold the aesthetic appeal of Sutton Lakes, the Board of Directors and the Architectural Review Board (ARB) would like to offer some suggestions and reminders:

- 1. Before you perform any exterior modification, please ensure you fill out the proper paper work and have the project approved by the ARB. This includes, but is not limited to, new fences, new roofs, additions, new paint colors, or pavers/additions to driveways.
- 2. Remember that boats, trailers, and other recreational vehicles should not be stored in view.
- 3. Please keep your property clean and fresh by pressure washing your fence, driveway and house, and have your roof professionally cleaned.
- 4. Please maintain the exterior of your house by making sure your lawn and shrubbery are consistently trimmed, your fence is properly upright, and your mailbox is free of mold/mildew.

Please remember that all trash cans and recycling bins must be kept out of view. This does include the new bins that were distributed by the City of Jacksonville.

WHO, WHAT, WHEN, AND WHERE: A FEW FAQ'S

Who do I call if I see a street light out or burning during the day? Write down the pole number and call JEA at 665-6000.

Who do I call about potholes in the streets or damaged sidewalks? Call the city at 630-CITY or file a request online at <u>www.coj.net</u>.

Who do I call about trash pickup and special trash pickups? Call the city at 630-CITY.

Do I need approval for modifications to the exterior of my house? YES – find the request form on the website, <u>www.suttonlakes.org</u>. This form needs to be filled out completely and all the necessary information provided by the homeowner. Modifications include, but are not limited to: fences, screen rooms, pools, painting, new siding, new roof, major landscaping, and new mailboxes.

When are Board meetings held? The Board meets the 3rd Monday of the month, typically at the Front Pool Gazebo. Meetings typically begin at 6:30. Keep an eye on the info board and website for this information as well. Who do I call with issues about the pool, basketball courts, playgrounds, or the front entrance (common areas)?
